Reflections on 2008

IN MY TWO YEARS AS BOARD PRESIDENT, I have had the honor of watching Rainbow Village grow into a strong, sustainable, proactive organization.

As the only nonprofit in the St. Louis metropolitan area that focuses solely on providing long-term, affordable, quality homes for people with developmental disabilities, we have always taken our responsibility to our residents seriously. In the past two years, I have seen staff and board members raise the bar for Rainbow Village.

We have become more proactive, with our staff and board focusing on making our strategic plan a reality. We have set significant goals to maintain the quality of our current homes, while expanding to provide more homes. In July we opened our 47th home.

MAKING FRIENDS AND RAISING FUNDS. Together with the hard work of staff and committee members, and with the generosity of our friends, the Somewhere Over the Rainbow Dinner-Auction was a continued success. More than 220 people attended our 2008 event, netting \$95,000 for Rainbow Village, up \$5,000 from 2007. The Third Annual Fund-a-Need brought an additional \$20,600 which will fund needed capital improvements at our homes.

New in 2008, several board members and supporters helped raise friends, awareness and funds for our organization, hosting coffees and cocktail parties with the goal of introducing Rainbow Village to their friends. These evenings have proven to be a huge success, adding hundreds of friends to our roster. The 2009 calendar is already filling with more friend-raisers.

OUR ACCOMPLISHMENTS. On many levels we have grown beyond the passion of our founders into a sustainable organization. Our 'green' home completed in 2007 has won several awards, and received the prestigious LEED certification. And we have expanded the reach of our staff to create a more self-sustaining organization.

As we continue our commitment to maintaining our homes to the highest standards, we made over \$209,000 worth of capital improvements to our homes and the Sunnen Community Center in 2008. Keeping our homes beautiful was achieved with the help of over 225 volunteers from many local companies, churches and student groups from universities. Their generous donation of time and talent included staining decks and ramps, raking leaves, landscaping and painting.

We executed our strategic plan goals regarding community awareness and marketing. An attitudinal research study was conducted to ascertain our target audiences and determine our branding messages. As a result, we established a new logo, developed new marketing materials and appeared in the media more than 60 times.

Above all, I believe we emphasized our roots, focusing on what a compassionate organization we are. In the past two years, we have made clear to our many audiences that Rainbow Village is so much more than bricks and mortar. We provide homes where people want to live; we have a board people want to serve on; and we provide an environment where people love coming to work everyday.

New Home in 2008

Rainbow Village's reputation for quality long-term homes for people with developmental disabilities is spreading.

Creative Concepts for Living (CCL), a support service agency that we had not partnered with in the past, contacted us on behalf of three of their clients who were living in a rented home that was being poorly maintained. The residents and staff had to deal with a leaking roof, buckling linoleum floors and broken heating and cooling systems.

Executive Director of CCL, Denise Millham-Quirk told us "for the safety of our clients we want to move them into a Rainbow house because we have received great recommendations about the service Rainbow Village provides to their houses."

Rainbow to the rescue! We purchased a home in Florissant for the women and renovated it by painting, installing a new electrical service panel, hard-wired smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and remodeling the bathroom. The previous owners built the house to be accessible for their son and wanted the house to be used by others needing accessibility. This house is perfect for the women, two of whom use wheelchairs.

The women moved in July 2008 and are now enjoying a safe and comfortable Rainbow Village home. All three of the women, Candace, Michelle and Christa, work at Valley Industries. They are happy that they were able to stay in North County where they can be close to work and their favorite social activities.

We were able to provide these residents with a beautiful and safe home thanks to the generous grants received for down payment assistance from the **Productive Living Board of St. Louis County, Orthwein Foundation, Boeing Employee Community Fund, Pott Foundation and The Sander Charitable Trust.** Thanks for helping us realize more dreams as we all know that home is where the heart is.

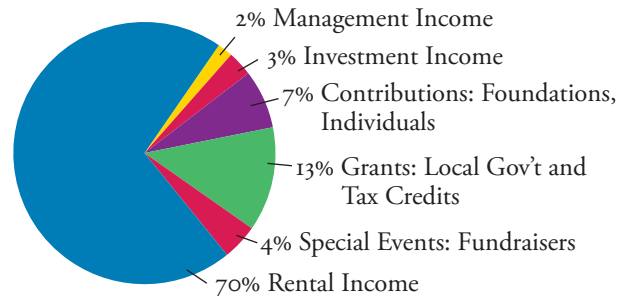

For the year ended December 31, 2008

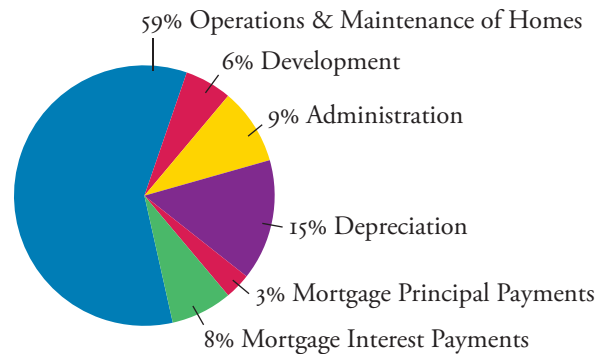
REVENUE ANALYSIS

"The entire family is so pleased that he enjoys independence, a social network of friends and employment at Valley Industries", said his brother Ron on a recent campus visit.

Every Rainbow Village resident contributes in whatever way he/she can. Fran's specialty is his "clean machine" personality. He gets a lot of satisfaction by keeping his house and yard looking great and is proud he can make a positive contribution. Come by any afternoon and you can see him outside raking leaves or shoveling snow. Fran also loves his weekly bowling outings and watching Cardinal games on TV with his housemates. His favorite entertainers are Elvis and The Three Stooges.
